In the article *Miguel Cabrera suspended seven games for touching off brawl* by Andrew Marchand, it gives the outcomes of the fight during the Yankees Detroit game last week.

On Thursday, Aug 24 at Comerica Park in Detroit, Michigan, Detroit athlete, Miguel Cabrera was suspended for seven games because of fighting during the game.

Cabrera was not the only player of the night to be suspended. A total of four players from both baseball teams were suspended that night.

From the Yankees, Gary Sanchez and Austin Romine were suspended--Sanchez for four games and Romine for two--for "throwing punches."

On the Detroit side, besides Cabrera, pitcher Alex Wilson received a four-game suspension for "intentionally throwing a pitch" at Yankee batter, Todd Frazier.

The tension started after Detroit pitcher Michael Fulmer hit Yankee batter, Gary Sanchez, who had just hit a homerun. Fulmer did not receive any suspension.

There were several players who did not receive suspensions, but did receive fines. These included Yankees Joe Girardi, Rob Thomsan, Tommy Kahnle, and Detroit shortstop, Joe Iglesias. Garrett Cooper and Clint Fraizer of the Yankees were also fined for entering the field while on the disabled list.

Cabrera spoke out about the incident and said, "Watch the video. See the people throw punches. See the people go after me when I was on the floor. I don't ask that you give me fewer games. I don't care. I take my responsibility."

Cabrea expressed anger about other payers lack of suspension. He felt as though Aaron Judge of the Yankees should have been penalized because he attempted to hit Cabrera.

The Yankees management is going to try to attempt to "stagger" the games that Sanchez and Romine are suspended, so that they have at least one the players available.
